Creation Review



- * God created all things visible and invisible out of nothing.
- * The development of His creation appears to have taken place over a **long period** of time.
- * It was **good** and beautiful: God caused every tree **beautiful** to the sight and **good** for food to grow from the ground. (Gen 2:9)
- * Man was formed out of what had been created previously, as pinnacle of Creation, giving living beings a *living soul* made in the *image and likeness* of God
 - * Given the responsibility to be the **steward** over all God's creation.
 - * In direct communion with God.

- * The Story of Genesis next tells us what happened after Man's formation.
- * What comes next?
- * Knowing Man needed to be perfected in love with free will, he **demanded obedience**, to remain in union with Him, with **penalty of death**.
- * What unfolds in this story was part of God's **process** of **perfection** of Man.
- * Enter serpent the tempter

Why Was Tempter In The Form of a Snake?



John Chrysostom

In the beginning the snake was a friend of man and one of the closest of those who served him. It was similar to that of the dog today.

In ancient mythology the snake was a symbol of wisdom.

And the woman said..., "We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden; but of the fruit of the tree which is in the middle of the garden, God said, 'You shall not eat from it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die.'" (con)

FALL OF MANKIND

• Then the serpent said..., "You shall not die by death. For God knows in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like gods, knowing good and evil."



FALL OF MANKIND





- Tempted to disobey God and become god.
- Disobeyed God
- Made a **created object** their **desire** instead of God.
- Wanted to be their own god.



- Genesis continues the story:
- Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings. (Gen 3:7)

What is the Significance of Hiding Their Nakedness?

Lost glory of God and now only saw lower things of this earth.


Soul came under the domination of the body and its passions.

Became Self-centered.

Separated themselves from Spirit.

Lost their dispassion and began the passionate earthly life.





What Was God's Response?



- Genesis story continues:
- And they heard the sound of the Lord **God walking** in the garden in the cool of the day.... Then the Lord God called to <u>Adam</u> and said to him, "Where are you?"
- "Where are you?" What does this indicate?
 - Indicates **separation** from God and God's immediate searching for them to return.
 - God is calling for them to repent. See how foundational this idea of repentance is?

HOW DID ADAM AND EVE RESPOND?

Adam says:

• I was **afraid** because I was naked; and I hid myself."

"The woman whom You gave to be with me, **she gave me** of the tree, and I ate."

Eve says:

• "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

HOW DID ADAM AND EVE RESPOND?

- Responded with self-justification.
 - Adam blamed Eve
 - Eve blamed the snake.
- There was no humility, no remorse, no repentance.



WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES OF THE FALL?

- We inherited Death.
- And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, "Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die." (Gen 2:15-17)



What also happens?

MAN LOST HIS HOME IN THE KINGDOM OF GOD.



Then the Lord God said, "Behold, the man has become like one of Us, to know good and evil. And now, lest he put out his hand and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live forever"— therefore the Lord God sent him out of the garden of Eden to till the ground from which he was taken. So He drove out the man; and He placed cherubim at the east of the garden of Eden, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to guard the way to the tree of life.

(Gen 3:22-24)

See God's mercy?

By not allowing man to live forever in this condition of separation, He sends him on a path of perfection.

DID GOD REJECT MAN?

- God did <u>not</u> reject man.
 He took away neither His image,
 freedom of his will, nor his reason.
 Man still had image of God tarnished.
- God desires Man's perfection. Called to cooperate to become in His likeness.
- Needed help of a supernatural power to **overcome death**, sin and **return** to a **union with God**.

REFLECT

- Man created with "living soul" in full communion with God.
- Made what is created the object of his desire.
- Sought pleasure from things (fruit of the tree) of this world rather than from his Creator.
- Separated from God relying only on own will.
- Brought consequence of **death** upon himself and all ancestors who followed.
- This is what we call ancestral sin.
 - Condition we inherit without guilt.
 - Our Fallen nature part of our genetic makeup.

HOW DOES REALITY OF DEATH IMPACT US?

- Self-Preservation, fear and anxiety: Self-assertion, egoism, hatred, envy.
- Fear of life becoming meaningless:
 Strive to prove ourselves, seek self-worth, compliments and success, fear insults, envy others success and desire to be liked.
- Seek security and happiness in wealth, glory and bodily pleasures
- Zealous over idealistic principles of love yet hate closest neighbor.

DEATH A CONSEQUENCE NOT PUNISHMENT

• Fear of death comes from a separation from God and leads us to tendency for sinful actions:



Paul says:

As by one man sin entered into the world, and **death** by sin; and so **death** passed upon all men, for that all have sinned. (Rom 5:12)

The wages of sin is death. (Rom 6:23)

Last enemy to be destroyed is death (1Cor 15:26)

GUILTY OF ADAM'S SIN?

- Was there any mention of future generations being guilty of Adam's sin?
- The idea of our guilt is error & misleading.
- Issue not our guilt but the reality of Death that was a consequence of disobedience.
- We have a disease due to separation from God.
 We need healing spiritually.
- We do not have guilt as the result of "Original Sin." We only owe God our obedience.
- With obedience we overcome fear of death and death itself.

REVIEW: SPIRITUAL MESSAGE

- What is our fallen nature?
 - Separated from God.
 - Live in fear of sickness & death.
 - Orientation for seeking pleasures.
 - Have image and potential to become in His likeness.
- This is message of the Genesis story:
 Though Fallen, have potential for perfection.
- Now in **need of savior** to free us from our enslavement by death and reunite us with God.
- God provides through the Christ Event.

WHAT IS OUR AIM?



- Perfection to be reunited with God.
- Requires our cooperation but depends on grace.
- Through God's grace we gain understanding, deep knowledge and capability to carry out His teachings.

THEOSIS IS THE AIM



- This union we call Theosis
- To reach Theosis we first must be purified.
- Purification involves asceticism as Paul taught.




Run is such a way that you may obtain it. And everyone who competes for the prize is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a perishable crown, but we for an imperishable


crown.

- Therefore I run thus: not with uncertainty.
- Thus I fight: not as one who beats the air, but I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified. (1Cor 9:24-29)

THEOSIS IS THE AIM



• We are called to "mature in Christ" with striving and toil.



To them **God chose** to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the **glory of this mystery**, which is **Christ in you**, the hope of glory.

- Him we proclaim, warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom, that we may present every man mature in Christ.
- For this I toil, striving with all the energy which He mightily inspires within me. (Colossians 1:24-29)
- We thus become His agents in perfecting Creation.



• Theosis is

Not about being legalistically justified or being declared innocent of our sins.

Not about being "good" or "bad".


Not by adhering to dogma

About coming into **union** with God - discovering the **God within** our heart - knowing directly the personal God.

Then we will receive capability to do His will.



AIM IS THEOSIS



- Found through a relationship with God.
- Involves a process of many steps.
- Relationship we seek is a **personal mystical** one. The apostle Paul says, "I live; yet not I, but Christ lives in Me" (Gal 2:20)

Theosis

Grace is constantly present, and is rooted in us, and worked into us like leaven, from our earliest years, until the thing thus present becomes fixed in a man like a natural endowment, as if it were one substance with him. God visibly fills us, unites Himself with us and communes with us.







Economy of Salvation

- How was mankind (in general) to be justified, reconciled, redeemed, reunited with God?
- By the Christ Event Incarnation of God.
- This is the "free gift" that "came upon all men unto justification of life (Rom 5:18).



Incarnation

- As we read in Pascha
 Liturgy: In the beginning
 was the Word... And the
 Word was made flesh,
 and dwelt among us (John
 1:1,14)
 - God born of flesh byMary Theotokos
- Action needed for perfection of Man.



What Does Christ Do In His Humanness?


- Baptized in Jordan,
- Travels to cities preaching salvation,
- Experiences **human passions**: hunger, thirst, need for rest and sleep and **suffered** painful feelings.
- Has all human feelings. "He was troubled in spirit" (John 13:21)
- Strengthens spiritual powers with fasting and prayer.
- Places all human strivings in **submission** to the **Divine** will in Himself. "O My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from Me: nevertheless, not as I will, but as Thou wilt." (Matt 26:39)
- Shows us how to **unite** our human will to the Divine will through our "**living soul**." Connection with Spirit.

- Central Dogma: Christ is both fully human and fully God. Only- Begotten Son of God. One with the Father and the Holy Spirit.
- How was this defended?
 - Constantly at the **Ecumenical Councils**.
- ◆ To Transform Human Nature God had to become fully Human showing the path for our healing including the death of the flesh.
- God took on Human flesh so it could be perfected.

What is Significance of The Cross?

Redemption

- Being obedient even in death frees us.
- Central Dogma is Jesus Christ is redeemer and savior.
- He suffered out of His love for us.
- * "The Lamb of God Who taketh away the sin of the world." (John 1:29)
 - This image of the "Lamb" comes from Jewish passover sacrifice.



Redemption - The Cross

- Apostles very clear about this:
 - "Christ saved us";
- "you are redeemed from the curse of the law";
- Christ justified us"; "You are bought at a dear price";
- Christ "has covered our sins";
- He is a "propitiation for our sins";
- by Him we have been "reconciled with God";

- He is the "sole Chief Priest";
- "He has torn up the handwriting against us and nailed it to the Cross";
- He "was made a curse for us";
- we have peace with God "by the death of His Son";
- we have been "sanctified by His blood";
- we have been "resurrected together with Christ."

Redemption - The Cross

- * We **do not** view the self sacrifice on Cross as a **Payment**, like in fulfilling a contract to pay for our guilt some erroneously say we received from Adam..
- * It is **not** like a **substitution**. We are accountable for our own sinfulness.
- * It is a **sacrifice of love** and **obedience** that is essential for the resurrection to follow. For **victory over death** in Human flesh.
- * It **frees** all mankind from bondage to sin and **death** with hope of resurrection and eternal life.

More.... Resurrection

Resurrection

- Cross makes possible the **Resurrection**.


 By death of Christ on the Cross humankind attained redemption, meaning **death** is **defeated**.
- Through victory over death we gain eternal life and are shown path for our personal salvation.
- Resurrection is the object of Church's constant triumph, its unceasing rejoicing summit is Pascha. Our Sunday celebration.
 Foundation and crown of our Orthodox faith.
- How do we Follow?

Synergia: Theosis demands our cooperation

General vs Personal Salvation


- Two truths about salvation:
 - 1. General
 - 2. Personal
- Cross is about salvation in general.
 Christ offered Himself to claim victory over death, so all peoples can be saved.
- BUT, Personal salvation depends on each individual proper use of free-will
- Personal made possible by the General.
 - By sacrifice on Cross we are **liberated** from death. Know there is **life after death** if we **follow** Christ.
 - We must join with Him & cooperate to perfect ourselves to become united with Him in eternal life.

General Salvation



- St. Athanasius: "The Word perceived that corruption could not be gotten rid of any other way than through death; yet He Himself...being immortal... was such as could not die.
- For this reason... He assumed a body capable of death, in order that it... remaining incorruptible through His indwelling, might thereafter put an end to corruption for all others as well, by the Grace of the Resurrection.
- It was by surrendering to death, the body which he had taken, as an offering and sacrifice, free from every stain, that he forthwith abolished death for his human brother by the offering of an equivalent." (On the Incarnation, pp. 34-35).


Personal Salvation



The **personal Salvation** is expressed by Paul: God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, **not** imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation...

- we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God. (2 Corinthians 5:19-20)
- Personal salvation uses the same terminology as the salvation of the world: justification, redemption, reconciliation. Apostles have in mind those who believe in Christ and have received Holy Baptism.

Begin with Baptism



"He (Christ) according to His mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration (in Baptism), and renewing of the Holy Spirit... that being justified by His Grace, we might be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life." (Titus 3:5-7)

Baptism is seen as a **personal** resurrection in Christ.


Called: new birth, adoption, sanctification.



Personal Salvation

- Is it proper to say we must earn our way to salvation?
- We cannot earn salvation by our own efforts.
 Being good person not sufficient.
- We must first have **faith** and receive divine **grace**.
 - Then joined with Christ through Baptism and Chrismation we must be willing to **cooperate** with Grace to do good works.
- This requires **preparation** & **participation** in sacramental life of Church.

Faith and Works



Scripture says we are **saved by faith** and must **work out our own salvation**.

"Ye are saved through faith, and that not of yourself: it is the gift of God." (Eph 2:8)

* "Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling." (Phil 2:12)



Faith if it has not works is dead (James 2-14-20)

How do we reconcile these statements?

All are true. Personal salvation involves both.

Faith and Works

- Scripture also says,

 "Salvation involves acquiring eternal life in God, in the kingdom of Heaven. "But nothing unclean can enter the Kingdom of God" (cf. Eph 5:5, Rev 21:27)
- God is light and we must become sons of Light. Entrance requires purity of soul, garment of "holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord." (Heb 12:14)
- Scripture shows salvation involves more than being justified or acquitted for any offenses committed against God. Not legal type of issue, its a relationship.
- Our personal purification is a requirement and we must acquire Grace of Holy Spirit.

Purification

- Scripture tells us by **purification** we come to know the personal God and receive His grace.
- How are we purified?
 - Taming of our passions: carnal instincts, self-centered desires.
 - Ascetic practices such as prayer and fasting
 - Sacraments.
- ♣ Even with Baptism we will sin. Are weak. Baptism opens the door to the pathway for us to participate in the sacramental life of the Church. We must use our free will wisely.

Faith and Works

- By the Christ Event, Son of God came to:
 - a. Open path for personal salvation of all.
 - b. Direct our hearts to search and thirst for Kingdom of God and to give us help and power on this path to acquire **personal** spiritual purity and holiness.
- Pathway given totally by Christ General Salvation; Second depends on our **cooperation** through grace in the Holy Spirit. Synergia
- Following Him, Made in His Image, we become in His Likeness.

Theosis

- * Gregory Palamas: The "image" develops into "likeness," particularity by means of the virtues which are the work of the will helped by grace.
- * St. John of Damascus: "In the image' points therefore to the mind and freedom, and 'in the likeness' to the greatest possible similitude in virtue.
- * Christ came as the image incarnate to reestablish it and show us the way to Theosis.


The Holy Spirit and the Church

Christ makes a Promise

- After Resurrection what did Jesus Christ promise to the Apostles?
- Holy Spirit, Comforter, Who would remain with them forever.
- Also gave Apostles the grace-given power of the Holy Spirit with words:
 - "receive ye the Holy Spirit: whosoever sins ye remit, they are remitted unto them; and whosoever sins ye retain, they are retained." (John 20:22-23)

What happened on Pentecost?

- Descent of the Holy Spirit as He Promised.
- What gifts did this this bring?
- Extraordinary gifts to apostles signs, healings, prophecies, gifts of tongues and powers to lead the faithful to spiritual perfection.
- Peter says, the Holy Spirit, divine power, has given us "all things that pertain unto life and godliness" (2 Peter 1:3)



The Earthly Church of Christ

- Beginning of Church on earth. On this day Apostles baptized about 3000 men.
- From this moment on Jerusalem, Palestine, then whole Roman Empire, and beyond began to be covered with churches.



The Apostles appointed Bishops and presbyters and deacons giving their lives in this work.

The Earthly Church

- The Church is our **spiritual home**place of healing, of the Holy Spirit.
- Christ is the Head, Founder, Foundation and Chief Priest.
- Where a Christian heals his separateness, making use of the grace given means of working our our salvation given by Holy Spirit through the Church.
- In the Church one is **led** to purification, illumination and Theosis.
- His children are prepared for the heavenly homeland.








Scripture and Church Tradition
